A NEW APP BY MICROSOFT

Microsoft has released Seeing AI — a smartphone app that uses computer vision to describe the world for the visually impaired. With the free app downloaded on the iPhone, a user can point their phone's camera at a person and it will say who they are and how they are feeling. They can also point it at a product and it will tell them what it is. All of this is done using artificial intelligence that runs locally on their phone.

The apps most basic functions are carried out directly on the device itself. This means they can be accessed more quickly and in situations where there is no stable internet connection. However, Seeing Al's experimental features — like describing an entire scene or recognizing handwriting — require a connection to the internet.
